Admissions Requirements

- Students must be 18 years of age or older.
- A high school diploma (or equivalent) is required.
- Students must have their pastor's permission to enroll.

Any involvement of a student in HC must be approved by the student's pastor. The student must have his pastor's approval and recommendation before any applicant will be considered. The student must also remain in contact with their pastor throughout the training process. Accountability of the Hope Corps student is to their own pastor. Any student who serves a mission must be in contact with their pastor on a weekly basis.

3 Online Courses

Courses are provided through Wilson University. This is a university level non-degree program called The Apostolic Foundations Certificate. It consists of 12 university credits that may apply towards an AA or BA degree when continuing education at Wilson University.

Intensive Training Week

An ITW consists of seven days, or more, of intensive training and practical experience on location. Intensive Training Week is tough, intense, spiritual, and practical.

3

Graduation

Upon graduation the student is officially granted Hope Corps alumni status.

Lifetime of Service

There are many options for Hope Corps alumni to serve in the Kingdom. Along with a growing community of Hope Corps alumni, you have the opportunity to participate in a myriad of local, regional, national, and international initiatives that are advancing the work of God. (To Participate in any Hope Corps activities the graduate must have pastoral approval.

3 Online Courses + 1 Intensive Training Week





BIBLICAL PRINCIPLES

This course teaches students to think critically about biblical principles and equips them to form a consistent and cohesive worldview. The course also provides an overview of the Bible with emphasis on the key events, primary figures, and principle themes.



THEOLOGICAL ESSENTIALS

In this course, students analyze, defend, and apply foundational theological topics and key doctrines of the Christian faith including salvation, the Godhead, and holiness.



INTERCULTURAL STUDIES (ONSITE)

In order to develop a basic level of crosscultural competency, this course will challenge students to learn about the way people from various cultural backgrounds think, behave, and communicate. The students will also explore foundational understandings of the field of missiology. The majority of this course is completed at the ITW.



LEADERSHIP FORMATION

In this course, students examine spiritual formation as an initial and ongoing foundation for the development of their leadership capacity. Students discover their strengths and explore God's calling in their life. Concepts include spiritual disciplines, spiritual authority, types of leadership, and passion for leadership.
